


PROGRAM OVERVIEW

In Uganda, we will volunteer at the Uganda Wildlife Education Center, living on-site and assisting veterinarians and biologists and keepers in working with chimpanzees and lions, elephants and parrots, giraffes and rhinoceroses and more. You'll meet Sushi, a shoebill stork, and Charles, a four-yearold elephant. They will become your friends, as will baby chimpanzees. Then it's on safari, trekking for chimpanzees in the wild. Plus, elephants and lions, hippos and monkeys. You'll be awe-struck. All this while studying wildlife conservation issues, animal intelligence, and our relationship to the creatures with whom we share this beautiful and fragile planet. Uganda -- this is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.


