

# PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Makah Culture Past and Present examines the archaeology and history of this Native American Tribe and then spends almost two weeks on their reservation experiencing contemporary and traditional Makah Culture. Mornings are spent in a variety of volunteer placements in the community ranging from Head Start to the Senior Center. Afternoons and evenings focus on traditional and contemporary culture. Each year is a little different but past classes have included traditional stories by a Makah storyteller, a Makah language class, basket weaving and carving, local foods, hikes in the rain forest and on the beach, tribal government and the relationship between environmental protection legislation and Makah Culture. The result is immersion in Makah Culture.
